Questions for you to consider:

Why? Why are you creating this show? What is your vision for it? Who will be your audience and why?

Who else is involved? Cast and crew, producing team (includes playwrights, directors, producers, venues, marketers), sponsors and partners (funding agencies, private sponsors or philanthropists, partners (venues, rehearsal space, in-kind support).

Mentor/Support Networks? Do you have someone who can guide you in this process. Who has done it before and can provide useful advice and/or connections/support.

Timeframe? Ensure you give you and your team enough time to do what you want to do. This includes the planning stage as well as resourcing, rehearsal, development of the work, production, marketing.

Budget? Do you want to pay yourself and your cast/crew/team for your work? If so, what do you think is suitable? What other costs do you need to consider (see resources section above)?
